### **Executive Summary:**

*Major outcomes, results and impact of the Chair, including on national policies, in relation to its objectives as stated in Article 2 of the Chair Agreement (between the Institution and UNESCO)*

Between December 2012 and December 2014 significant progress was made in each of the main specific objectives of the Chair, namely, to reframe the debate on Migration, Development and Human Rights; to promote a North-South/South-South dialogue and an alternative agenda on the subject; to develop strategic indicators for a necessary demystification of the field; and to actively participate in the Global Forum on Migration and Development and other pertinent fora and international events.

This progress report consigns: (a) the realization of graduate courses in 4 universities, 5 training workshops in 3 continents, and 5 funded research projects (with an overall budget of more than 700,000 USD); (b) the attainment of an intense agenda by the chairholder in the organization/participation of 35 meetings and conferences in 14 countries of the 5 continents; (c) the publication of 8 authored/edited books, 15 book chapters, 8 journal articles and 5 research reports; (d) the publication of 4 issues of the

bilingual Journal *Migración y Desarrollo*; (e) the promotion of 6 interuniversity exchanges/partnerships, together with the launching a new structure of the International Network on Migration and Development (associated to the Chair) based on 7 regional nodes with a worldwide coverage and the creation of a scientific committee integrated by 20 leading scholars in the field; and (f) the realization of 5 cooperation activities with the UNESCO regional office in Mexico and the UNESCO-MOST group in Mexico.

Through these activities, significant advances were made in the development of a comprehensive, inclusive and emancipatory position in the field (what we conceive of as a Southern position); the strengthening of the linkages between academia and social organizations and movements in global governance; and the analysis of highly-skilled migration from a critical and constructive standpoint.
