1. Executive Summary:

Major outcomes, results and impact of the Chair, including on national policies, in relation to its objectives as stated in Article 2 of the Chair Agreement (between the Institution and UNESCO)
(Not exceeding 300 words)

Significant progress was made in each of the main specific objectives of the Chair: to reframe the debate on Migration, Development and Human Rights; to promote a North-South/South-South dialogue and an alternative agenda on the subject; to develop strategic indicators for a necessary demystification of the field; and to actively participate in the Global Forum on Migration and Development and other pertinent fora and international events.

This progress report encompasses: (a) the co-organization of the VIII World Social Forum on Migrations; (b) the active participation with the global migration group of the Foundation for European Progressive Studies; (c) the organization/participation in 38 meetings and conferences in 11 countries; (d) the participation as leading author in the International Panel on Social Progress; (e) the publication by the Chairholder of 2 books, 2 edited books, 23 book chapters, and 23 refereed Journal articles; (f) the coordination of a special issue of the Journal *Globalizations* together with Linköping University and Ankara University; (g) the publication of 7 issues of the Journal *Migración y Desarrollo*, including the 15th anniversary special issue; (h) the restructuring of the curriculum of the

Doctoral Program in Development Studies and its ratification in the highest rank of graduate programmes in Mexico (international competence); (i) the leading role played by the Chairholder in the reform process of the Autonomous University of Zacatecas aimed at endowing it with a new and crucial role: to act as an agent of development and social transformation.

Through these activities, significant advances were made in the development of a comprehensive, inclusive and emancipatory position in the field (what we conceive of as a Southern or counterhegemonic position); the strengthening of the linkages between academia and social organizations and movements in global governance; and the analysis of highly skilled migration from a critical and constructive standpoint.

- Publication of the book: *Highly qualified Mexican migration facing the 21st century: problems and challenges*, commissioned by Conacyt.
- Publish an edited *Handbook on migration and development* for Edward Elgar Publishing
- Publish the reader entitled: *On the theory and practice of migration and development* for IMISCOE SPRINGER Migration series.
- Continue our collaboration with the Global Coalition on Migration and other migrant organizations.
- Publish issues 35, 36, 37 and 38 of the Journal *Migración y Desarrollo*.

The medium- and long-term development prospects of the Chair are targeted toward the consolidation and reinforcement of the institutional framework associated to the Chair, promoting Interuniversity Exchanges/Partnerships between the Chair and other institutions including UNESCO Chairs/UNITWIN Networks, seeking further external financial support through research projects, reinforcing the regional nodes of the international network on migration and development, and fostering the collaboration initiatives with civil society organizations and the research agenda underlying the Chair.
